



## **Jackson E. Reasor, Jr.**

### **Biographical Information**

Jack Reasor, President and CEO of Old Dominion Electric Cooperative and the Virginia, Maryland, and Delaware Association of Electric Cooperatives, was born in Danville, VA. He received his B.A. from Lincoln Memorial University in Harrogate, TN and then graduated from the T.C. Williams School of Law at the University of Richmond, VA. He became a member of the State Bar of Virginia in 1978.

He formerly served as a Vice President of First Virginia Bank in Bluefield and President of Premier Trust Company in Bluefield. Prior he was a partner in the law firm of Galumbeck, Simmons, and Reasor in Tazewell, VA.

From 1992-98 he was a Virginia state senator from Southwest Virginia, representing the 38<sup>th</sup> Senate District. He served on several committees, including the VA Code Commission and was chairman of three legislative subcommittees—Juvenile Justice and Family Law, the Unemployment Compensation Act, and Electric Utility Restructuring. He also was chairman of the Virginia Coal and Energy Commission.

Jack and his wife, the former Cynthia Davis, also an LMU graduate, are the parents of daughter Megan, a graduate of Old Dominion University, and a son, Bryan, a graduate of Virginia Commonwealth University. They moved from Bluefield to Richmond in June 1999.

Jack currently serves as a board member for several organizations: Virginia Center for Coal and Energy Research, the Henrico County Education Foundation, the Center for Rural Virginia and is a past Chairman of the Virginia Chamber of Commerce. He currently serves as Chairman of the Board of Trustees for Averett University.
